The Humanity Pact serves as a luminary beacon of hope and a comprehensive blueprint for the radical restructuring of international relations and socio-economic frameworks. It aligns with and accelerates the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), fostering a more just, equitable, and humane world.

Alignment with Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)

By integrating SDG targets into its core strategies, the Humanity Pact promises to reshape the global landscape, ensuring that every initiative not only contributes to immediate improvements but also propels global progress towards these universally agreed-upon goals.

We adopt here the classic definition of sustainability from the UN 1987 report, which stated that it is "meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of the future generations to meet their own needs." Nevertheless this definition has two halves (more details in Ritchie 2024). The first is ensuring that everyone in the world today- the present generation- can live a good and healthy life, this is the socio-economic component. The second half is about making sure that we live in a way that does not degrade nature/environment for next generations. In some definitions, there's no requirement for humans to meet their own basic needs at the same time that environmental protection is needed. The Indigenous principle, from Kenyan Proverb, "Treat the Earth well: it was not given to you by your parents, it was loaned to you by your children." This shows a deep understanding of these 2 halves of sustainability" Nevertheless these native communities achieved environmental sustainability were always small and that is because the rate of child mortality was very high, and in a world which half of all children die is not meeting "the needs of the present generations"

2. Co-Creation Process

The Humanity Pact was developed through a democratic and inclusive process involving 110 visionary thinkers from 45 countries, representing diverse sectors such as academia, activism, business, political parties and grassroots movements. This process emphasized collaboration and pooled diverse insights to set strategic objectives for equitable and sustainable global cooperation.

This inclusive process ensured that the Humanity Pact reflects a wide array of perspectives and experiences, enhancing its relevance and effectiveness in addressing global challenges. The involvement of diverse thinkers from various sectors and regions ensured a holistic approach to the development of the pact, making it a truly global initiative.
